

PUBLIC NOTICE

OPPORTUNITIES FOR INTERNSHIP IN THE FY 2019/2020

1. The Tanzania Employment Services Agency (TaESA) under the Prime Minister's Office – Labour, Youth, Employment and Persons with Disability in collaboration with the private sector fraternity is inviting graduates to register for Internship trainings in the FY 2019/2020. Internship training is designed to provide opportunities for industrial attachments to graduates. It is a valuable opportunity for graduates to acquire relevant employable skills, work experience, altitude and work ethics needed by employers in the local and global labour markets.
2. Interested graduates may register physically by visiting TaESA offices in Dar es Salaam, Mwanza, Dodoma and Arusha. Graduates outside the mentioned regions may as well register by filling in [jobseekers'/internship registration form](#) downloadable through TaESA's website www.taesa.go.tz and return the same through info@taesa.go.tz.
3. Key considerations for graduates wishing to participate:-
 - (i) Only graduates considering internship as an opportunity for enhancing their employability and labour market competitiveness will be considered for available opportunities;
 - (ii) Internship is a training and not employment, as such Interns connected will not be liable for any employees remunerations;
 - (iii) Interns will need to provide evidence that they will remain in the workplace for the period between six months to one year;
 - (iv) Selected graduates will also need to provide evidence that they will abide with the rules and regulations of each particular workplace;
 - (v) Interns will cater for their necessary expenses for undertaking internship that includes living expenses like accommodation, food, medical expenses, etc. The government may when deemed necessary and on request provide a token amount monthly to subsidize for travel costs;
 - (vi) Before being placed to employers registered graduates will undergo through important scrutiny processes including interview, selection, background checks and pre-job placement trainings to ensure employers get quality Interns with basic work ethics.
